Worth County 4-H celebrates National 4-H Week with fun facts

National 4-H week will be celebrated this week October 6 – 12.

Here are a few facts about 4-H in honor of the week:

- 4-H is the nation's largest youth organization. It has six million participants. There are 4-H Clubs in more than 80 countries. All 50 states have 4-H organizations and all 99 of Iowa Counties have 4-H. One-Quarter of Iowa's young people are in 4-H. Worth County 4-H has one third of its youth enrolled in 4-H and has one of the highest percentage of youth club enrollment in Iowa

- 4-H follows the philosophy of learning by



doing. Youth develop life skills through hands on projects that range from citizenship to expressive arts, communication to food and nutrition and leadership to science and technology.

- 4-H uses a four – leaf clover for its emblem. Each leaf carries an H; the H's stand for Head, Heart, Hands and Health. The 4-H emblem

originated in Clarion, Iowa.

- 4-H is for youth in grades 4th -12th. Youth can belong to a traditional 4-H Club or Special Interest Youth Group. They can make new friends, visit new places, go on trips, attend workshops and conferences, host meetings, and serve their communities.

- 4-H Members do not have to live on a farm or have livestock to be in 4-H. There are 34 different project areas to explore in 4-H. Many city kids are 4-Hers. There are 13 4-H Clubs in Worth County that represent all seven towns.

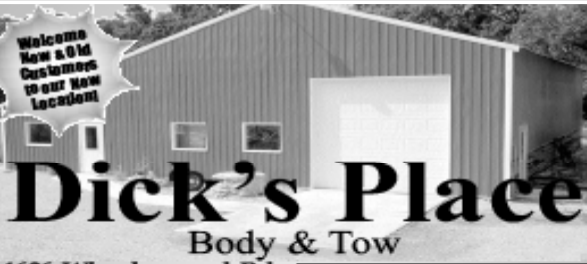

4-H Club members gain more the longer they are in a club

Iowa 4-H members in a club show more gains in knowledge the longer they are members of a club, based on results of a survey of Iowa 4-H club members.

"The issue of 'dosage,' or how long a youth is in 4-H, has been discussed at the national extension level as an essential element," said Marybeth Foster, Iowa 4-H organizational accountability manager.

4-H healthy living. 4-H is the youth development program of Iowa State University Extension and Outreach.

"The results from our three-year club survey confirm this concept does have merit. Length of time in 4-H matters to learning and development," Foster said.

Members were surveyed by club in 2016, 2017 and 2018. Over that three-year period, 4-H members were surveyed at a monthly club meeting. In total, 1,223 youth who were part of 100

clubs were surveyed.

The surveys were analyzed by the Research Institute for Studies in Education at the Iowa State University School of Education. The institute partners with Iowa 4-H Youth Development to conduct program evaluation annually.

Youth were asked to indicate on a five-point scale if they had increased their knowledge in the areas of communications; learning; citizenship; leadership; healthy living; aspirations in science, technology, engineering and math; and STEM attitudes based on knowledge before 4-H and after participating in 4-H.

Iowa 4-H previously conducted a survey of club members in 2008 with 508 youth participating. The 2008 study looked at citizenship, leadership and communication.

The 2016-2018 study involved three independent samples of club members. The Research Institute for Studies in Education looked at

the systematic differences over time. The effect of 4-H club membership for youth was stable over the three-year period, but high school members gained more than those in fourth through eighth grades. This demonstrates the impact of longer time or dosage in 4-H club experiences. The researchers saw a significant difference in gains each year when examining youth knowledge after their 4-H participation compared with before their 4-H participation.

Iowa 4-H members consistently learn during their club experience. Girls generally showed larger gains than did boys, expect for STEM aspirations. Senior 4-H members (grades 9-12) tended to outgain junior members in grades 4-6, which would be expected, Foster noted.

This study reinforced the idea that the length of time a youth is in 4-H matters to their overall learning.

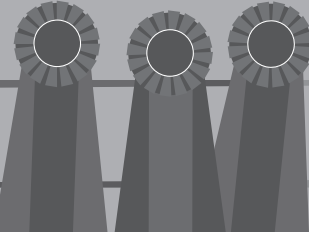
